Addendum Number 1

General Addendum Items:

1. Placement of new panels along each side of the common wall between the two rooms - 7 (4x8) panels, mounted on the walls as illustrated on sheet A2.01. This pattern will be the same for both sides of the common wall.

Placement of the new panels along the east wall of both rooms to be - 1. South Room - 7 (4x6) panels, one mounted at each end of the existing row of panels and one mounted between each window. 2. North Room - 4 (4x6) panels, one mounted at each end of the existing row of panels and one mounted between each of the windows.
