- 1- Is it important to you that we show our bid bond with our Management Plan/Statement of Qualifications, in order to be short listed? Or do we go about it the standard way and turn in our bid bond with our bid? **Answer – Bid bonds turned in at Bid time with Bid. Only general information such as bonding company and limits is needed with SOQ's**
- 2- Will our Management Plan/Statement of Qualifications have any persuasive power with our bid? Or is the project going to be rewarded strictly to the low bid contractor. **Answer - Strictly low bid, unless DFCM is concerned with the low bid, then the next responsive bidder may be considered.**
